

FACT



- Today 11 toddlers will swallow something in the home so harmful that they will be admitted to hospital.
- Today 6 Children will be admitted into hospital because of a burn caused by a hot drink or hot bath water!



Our Vision




To bring about a substantial reduction in unintentional injuries and death caused by preventable accidents.

Aims



- Working with children, parents/carers and partner agencies, to promote consistent positive safety messages to children and their families, through posters, safety packs and calendars.
- To raise parental awareness of home safety and associated risks for pre-school children
- Provide and install "free" home safety equipment to families in the bottom 30% SOA

- Developed partnerships with East Lancashire Fire and Rescue, BwD Borough Council, Sure Start Children's Centres and others




How?

- A list of all eligible families is generated by each Health Visiting team.
- The NN visits the family for a Home Safety Session. Home safety equipment is offered and measurements taken.
- The NN will complete a referral form and send to our fitting partners at the Borough.
- The Borough will administer the referral and fitting is carried out by the Home Safety Technicians.
