- we must make the case for the marginalised and excluded












The socio-political case for inclusion

- Inclusion is...
 - a requirement for identifying needs
 - a component of prioritisation

The business case for inclusion

- Inclusion...
 - leads to savings on benefits and services
 - creates routes to employment
 - brings people into the market place
 - results in economic activity and growth







The business case for inclusion

VCS annual contribution to local economy

Lincolnshire: £410 million

- Nottingham: £227 million

North West: £5.3 billion

London: £19 billion











The focus on job creation

- Heseltine on the RGF:
 - first round: "successful bids...
 showed an ability to deliver a large
 number of sustainable jobs in the
 right area"
 - second round: "create and safeguard jobs in areas with a reliance on employment in the public sector"








Ensuring inclusion
