free nursery education for 2 year olds

- Government intends to introduce a legal requirement to secure free provision so that specified 2 year olds will be entitled to 570 hrs of free early education
- 20% most disadvantaged 2 year olds (approx. 130,000 children) entitled from September 2013
- Extended to 40% of children from September 2014
- 260,000 2 year olds entitled to a free place by 2014/15
- Additional investment reaching £760mill by 2014/15



survey findings

The sector is ready to deliver!

- 37% currently involved in providing funded places for 2 year olds
- 63% said they are 'definitely' or 'very likely' to get involved
- Reasons quoted for keenness to be involved:
 - 1. opportunity to extend their support to disadvantaged children and
 - 2. supporting occupancy
- On average, nurseries expected to offer 10 places



survey findings

- 74% said the funding they receive covers their costs
- Funding shortfalls ranged from 35p £4hr
- Reasons quoted for reluctance to be involved:
 - 1. lack of capacity and
 - 2. uncertainty about sustainability
- Nearly half had not yet heard from their LA about plans for September 2012



developing provision

43% stated they need support to get involved in delivering the offer

Most commonly quoted support:

- Early year practice for 2 year olds
- Additional needs
- Financial / business planning
- Operation planning



developing provision

Other support needs quoted:

- Supporting parenting skills
- Behaviour management
- Capital funding to increase capacity
- Higher level child protection training



quality criteria

Criteria for delivering 2 year old places by September 2012

| Conditions | Percentage |
|---|------------|
| Good or outstanding Ofsted rating only | 47% |
| Good or outstanding Ofsted plus additional conditions | 29% |
| Satisfactory Ofsted rating plus additional conditions | 17% |



quality criteria

Additional conditions most commonly quoted were:

- Participation in a local authority quality assurance scheme
- Workforce e.g. EYP in place
- Participation in a provider network
- Participation in a national quality improvement scheme



additional support for children

69% providing funded places said they need to offer additional support

- Developmental delay
- Working with social workers
- Involvement in regular case conference meetings
- Home visits
- Increased non-contact time to complete paperwork
- Additional needs requiring one-to-one support



additional support for children

- Working with health professionals
- Sending staff on relevant training courses to help them meet the child's needs
- Investing a higher than usual amount of time working with and supporting parents
- Close involvement in child protection cases



additional support for children

"The children need more support with speech and language and PSE".

"Child protection conferences, one-to-one assessments and observations on a more regular basis, additional training and one-to-one meetings with the two year olds' key worker".



recommendations

- Funding must cover cost of delivery
- Support to access capital funding
- Reducing overheads
- Sector-specific support
- Support for workforce development
- Prompt engagement
