Commitment in Ending Gang and Youth Violence report to establish an EGYV team to provide practical advice and support to local areas.

EGYV team set up to help areas to:

- ➤ Map the different agencies which may be in contact with gang nominals and their families;
- ➤ Map the local gang or serious youth violence problem, using partnership data;
- ➤ Review their procedures for identifying gang members and potential victims;
- ➤ Gather independent feedback from local communities on what could be done better;
- Scrutinise prevention and enforcement strategies and suggest areas for improvement;
- ➤ Agree a practical action plan to improve the way gangs are tackled locally.

Core team is supplemented by **around 70 peer review advisers** from a range of backgrounds including safeguarding, health, and education, youth justice and employment.

Our approach



- Many issues have local solutions
- Intensive programme of support including workshops, teleconferences, peer reviews, sharing of effective practice and interactive sessions on the Knowledge Hub
- Peer review recommendations are actively monitored and areas given support to fulfil them
- Key issues for the IMG have been identified from the peer reviews and discussions with key partners such as the Expert Advisory Panel
