Building Community Capacity

- For older people in Leeds <u>now</u>;
 - 37 Local Organisations run by and for older people
 - Funded by £2.2M investment by the Local Authority/NHS
 (8 year contract currently in place) this enables the
 organisations to generate an additional (current) £3M
 from other sources to support their work
 - Since 1993 a long term growth strategy by the Local Authority starting with just one group.
 - Support more than 17,000 older people
 - Providing befriending services to more than 2,500 isolated older people
 - Relying on more than 5000 volunteers

Building Community Capacity

- Community Organisations as Support Brokers
 - Harnessing community resources to maximize the potential of Individual Budgets
 - Maximising the potential of Volunteers, Apprentices to Care – as the public sector shrinks...particularly in the North!
 - Utilising the skills of those retiring from the Local Authority/NHS/ wider public sector
 - Community Organisations as Enterprises
 - Establishing separate trading arms to market specific services (eg Long Term Condition self management)
 - Expansion into taking over and running former Local Authority facilities
 - Local Experts in providing information, guiding older people and their carers through the complex care system
