Recent trends in homelessness

Moderate increase

- But sustained decrease in Scotland, Finland, Netherlands
- More than average in Programme countries & England
- Increasing youth homelessness
 - Link with crisis & increasing youth unemployment
- Impact of migration
 - Flaws in migration policy increasingly lead to homelessness
 - Intra-EU migration
- Housing costs as cause of homelessness
 - Housing bubbles

Recent trends in homeless policies

National/regional strategies

- Integrated
- Growing number of MS develop/experiment with Housing-led strategies
 - But shelter system remains focus...
- Public budget cuts
 - More than average in England
 - Hit sustainable solutions to homelessness more than emergency solution
- Mobilisation/Responsibilisation of local policy makers
 - Are often faced with budget constraints
 - Increasing diversity within countries
- Evidence-based policies
 - Growing importance of data collection

- European Round Table of Ministers resp for Homelessness
 - 1 March
 - Irish Presidency
 - Call for EU framework on homelessness
 - England & Scotland present
 - Occasion to indentify common challenges and common actions

Some common health & homelessness trends

- Importance of mental health & addiction problems
 - Dual diagnosis
 - Suicide
- Underdeveloped cooperation between homeless sector and health sector
 - Uncoordinated & Unsustainable use of public health services
 - Emergency health care
- Ageing of homeless population
 - Health problems related to rapid ageing process
- Chronic diseases
 - HIV, Hepatitis
- Domestic violence

Some health & homelessness divergences

- Harm reduction vs Abstinence
- Street medicine vs Mainstream health care
- Housing Ready vs Housing First
- Institutional solutions vs DI
 - Confrontation of ideas as source of inspiration
 - Need for more evidence
 - No simple north-south divide

 - Role of training health care professionals...

 - Coverage / Affordability
 - Useful EU comparison...
- Communicable diseases
 - Homelessness as public health threat
 - Role of the EU fr early warning...

- End of life support
- Adherence to treatment
 - Peer support
 - Room for experimentation
