#### Current context

#### *Need for a student charter?*

- Better information and choice
  - expectation of undergraduate experience
  - what can students expect?
  - what is expected of the students?
- Value for money
  - More "bang for extra bucks" (Sally Hunt UCU General Secretary)
- More challenge for those who do not deliver?



#### Student Charter Group

- BIS funded report January 2011
  - information advice and guidance when starting and during a course
  - sets expectation of both parties
- Concise document linked to wider information
  - Front page for wider documentation
- Agreement between HEI and SU
  - Sign off by VC and President of SU



#### **Relationship with Students**

#### Legal basis

- Student contract
  - deliver on promises
  - certainty and clarity of rights and obligations
- Consumer contract
  - act fairly and reasonably
- Terms from a variety of sources
- Incorporation
  - Making students aware
  - Timing!



#### What has been promised?

#### Possible sources of contractual terms

- Student charter
  - sets out mutual expectations
  - provides links to other documents
- Rules, regulations and procedures
- Prospectuses and programme guides
- Key information sets
  - fees, teaching and learning, assessment
- Wider information sets
  - strategy and surveys
- Open days and oral information

#### Getting the contract right

#### Keeping promises

- Can a charter be contractual?
  - offer/acceptance
  - intention to create legal relations
  - certainty
- Review terms
  - which documents
  - when are they seen
  - who knows about them

### Student Complaints and Claims *Risks and consequences*

- Through internal procedures and to the OIA, Courts, QAA
- Potential scrutiny of the OFT
- Robust student complaints procedures in place
- Manage and monitor student complaints and claims
