 - Women and Family
 - Migrants
 - New Entrants

Homeless policies

- Integrated strategies comprehensive policy framework at national/regional level
- Evidence based approach data collection
- Housing led approach vs. staircase of transition
- Targeted prevention evictions, discharge
- Coercive measures criminalisation
- Social investment approach European Commission



EU and Homelessness

Policy: Social Investment Package (2013)

- framework for policy reforms
- guides MS to use social budgets efficiently and effectively
- life cycle approach
- focus on prevention
- Social investment in homelessness a priority - targeted, integrated, housing led policies on homelessness



EU and Homelessness

- Funding: Structural Funds to fund local projects to prevent and reduce homelessness
 - European Social Fund ref to homelessness
 - European Regional Development Funds transition from institutional to communitybased services – DI
 - New: Fund for European Aid for the most
 Deprived food, material assistance and social inclusion measures



EU and Homelessness

- Political level: link social and health policies to the Europe 2020 strategy targets
- Through a cycle of economic policy coordination: European Semester Process
- European Commission publishes Country Specific Recommendations
- In 2013 no CSR on homelessness, 11 CSR on health, reform of health systems



Social investment through social innovation

- Social innovation and social experimentation as a key tool to improve the quality and the cost-effectiveness of social policies
- Housing First Europe
 - Commission call for social policy experimentation – methodology RCT



Housing First as Health Intervention

- Origins in US and in health
- Housing stability, but effective in improving health outcomes?
- Beneficial effect on mental health but need more evidence on long-term impact
- Stabilisation of drug and alcohol use
- Limited evidence on physical health

 - Investing in Health
 - Sustainable health systems
 - People's health
 - Reducing health inequalities
