This workshop will cover the final arrangements fire and rescue services are making within their services and their partners for the Olympic Games. How can fire and rescue services and partners support each other to plan and deploy resources and services if and when required?

W4. Outsourcing of services within the fire and rescue service

This workshop will provide the opportunity for delegates to discuss what contribution outsourcing can make to efficiencies, what the barriers are and what the potential savings might be.

W5. Peer support – supporting each other

Delegates will have a chance to hear about how fire and rescue authorities support each other by acting as critical friends and partners. This workshop will also provide an opportunity to find out more about the Local Government Association and Chief Fire Officers' Association's redesigned sector led peer offer support model for fire and rescue authorities.

W6. Localism Act – general power and charging for unwanted and false alarms

This session will focus on fire and rescue authorities' general powers and their abilities to charge for services rendered (subject to statutory limitations) and unwanted automated fire alarms caused by misinstallations and malfunctions.
