Family with Multiple Needs



- Centres not reaching this small group
- Different needs, different services
- Parents enduring mental health problems, learning difficulties, substance misuse
- Children at risk developmentally, educationally, socially, cognitively

Family Action's Home based family support



- Works with families in their own homes
- Focus on children's safety and wellbeing
- Works with family members individually and together
- Work linked to other agencies

Work with families includes:



- Assess parents' difficulties and impact on children
- Focus on parenting home, food, school attendance
- Reduce children's caring responsibilities
- Help children understand problems

Home based support



- Service needed in own home
- Lasts 6 months to 1 year
- Expensive @ £4,000 per family
- High risk of family breakdown
 - Neglect
 - Parental hospitalisation
- Ready to attend centres at end of programme

Creative Childrens Centres



- Avoid arguing about lead agency
- Danger education or health leading
 - Focus on health and learning
- Bring more agencies within remit of centres – better value for money and better outcomes for children
- Voluntary organisations key role

Children's Centres



Family Action Centres: in addition to core services

- Family support, parental outreach
- Job centres and work skills
- Work with Young Families
- Work with fathers
- Partnerships with health visitors/midwives
- Parenting support
- Credit Unions
- Financial advice
- Relationship support, summer schemes

Big Society: let's grab this agenda



- Political Parties 500,000 members
- Church of England 1.4m on pews every week
- 3,500 Children's Centres
- 2.7m families attending weekly.
- Best centres engage parents, build confidence, participate in events, empower parents to work in community volunteering and peer support.
