
Muslims in the UK

Population of Great Britain: by religion, April 2001

- Muslims are the second largest religious group after Christianity.
- 1.6 Million, 2001
- Muslims comprised 3 per cent of the total population and over half (52 per cent) of the non-Christian religious population
- By 2008 estimated to increase to 2.4 million


