From Total Place to Community Budgets



- Greater Manchester Total Place focused on Early Years understanding the to deliver economic productivity we need to intervene early to ensure economically productive adults
- From Total Place came the clear understanding that resources needed to be pooled across the public sector to deliver better outcomes at a time of reduced funding
- The lessons learnt in Total Place are fundamental to the development of Community Budgets.

- Family A cost the police £50,000 in a year, responding to almost nightly reports of domestic violence
- Family B who have six out of seven children in care, as a result of poor parenting, at a cost of up to £210,000 a year
- Family C where responding to domestic abuse is costing the public sector up to £100,000 a year





- Shared outcome framework with services / interventions aligned in order to deliver improved outcomes.
 - From aligning cross public sector services to integrated teams
- Tracking of benefits to identify
 - cashable savings or unneeded resource
 - to invest as a partnership in future preventative work.



- This truly transformational pilot brings together both the public and private sector to share resources to help create career pathways for young children into local employers
- Partners are: Wigan Council, Job Centre, Abraham Guest Senior School, local private sector employers, Greater Manchester Police...

 - Reduction in child poverty






New ways of working include
